## Solo (verse and chorus chords, up to Em)

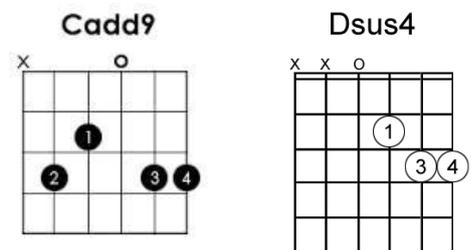
Well, I'm a runnin' down the road tryin' to loosen my load

**Strum :**

**d/x d/u x/u d/u**

For the intro, if you're wondering what a Cadd9 or Dsus4 is, you just have to keep the 3rd and 4th fingers of your G for these chords throughout the intro.

So you go from G, then to play Cadd9, you move down the first 2 fingers one string, then to play Dsus4, you move your index to the G string, 2<sup>nd</sup> fret (the usual shape of a D), still maintaining your ring finger and pinky on the 3<sup>rd</sup> fret... These chords are just hybrids, they sound pretty good



You play "normal" chords for the rest of the song. There is no noticeable difficulties, it's important that you listen to the song, and then you just have to:

"Take it easy"
